From the Desk of Superintendent, Dr. Mark Lenihan

Dear Parents, Patrons, and **Supporters of Wayne Community Schools:**

The 2024-25 school year is here and our staff is very excited to work with the students and partner with our parents and community members. As always, this summer has kept our staff very busy in preparing for school to begin. Our maintenance staff, secretarial staff, technology staff, and business office have done a tremendous job doing the important, behind the scenes work that makes our school run smoothly. We are very fortunate to have such a committed summer staff, and the work they do is greatly appreciated by all!

It has been a very busy, and rather messy summer at the school district with construction and renovation work occurring at the high school, the new parking lot south of the high school, and the wrestling room addition. It is always a hard push to complete major renovation work and upgrades in a few short summer months, and this year is no exception! To be brief, a new heating and cooling system has been added to the existing high school classrooms, the vocal music and art rooms have swapped locations, the

old wrestling room area, a new wrestling building, and we have added six new classrooms to the east side of the high school building! We also have completely renovated the science classrooms, and all three high school science rooms will be located at the east side of the high school.

Another important upgrade to the Jr/ Sr High School is a new fire alarm system. There also will be building security upgrades to our main entrance, and several other of our main doors at the Elementary School and Jr/Sr High School. We are also very excited about the much-needed improvements to the parking area south of the high school, which will include concrete parking, curbs, and lighting. The wrestling room addition, and the upgrades to the auditorium will not be ready until October 1st, which won't cause any disruption to the school schedule. As this phase of the project nears completion, the focus of our construction will be the new Pk-2nd grade Early Learning Center, which will open in fall of 2025. We are very excited to see the summer 2024 construction phase come to completion, and look forward to our new Early Learning Center facility that will expand our enrollment capacity substantially!


