From the Desk of Superintendent, Dr. Mark Lenihan

Dear Parents, Patrons, and Supporters of Wayne Community Schools:

As always, the school year is flying by as we are well into the 3rd quarter. One question I often receive as we near spring is, "What day is the last day of school?" Knowing March and April can still bring winter storms, we will announce the final day of school at the April 14, 2025 School

Board meeting. Doing this allows us the flexibility we need to assure we meet our instructional hour requirement, and hopefully provide families enough advance notice as you begin to plan your summer. Tentatively, the last day of school for grades K-11 will be Tuesday, May 20, 2025. Graduation will be on May 17, 2025 at the High School Gym. The seniors will

be let out earlier that week, and that will be decided in April as well. Typically, the last full day for seniors is the Monday before graduation, with a return on Tuesday morning for breakfast, the senior video, and graduation practice.

Construction continues on the new Wayne Community Schools Early Learning Center (ELC), and we are on track for a June 2, 2025 date for substantial completion. This will allow our staff to prepare the ELC for opening in August, 2025! The official name of the building will be the Wayne Early Learning Center (ELC). We are very excited about this new facility, and being able to educate our Preschool – 2nd grade students as we believe the focus on these primary years are key to student success in the future! It has been very enjoyable watching the progress on the ELC, and we will be very excited to

show all of our patrons the facility when it is complete. Look for an open house date sometime next summer before school starts!

As winter ends and spring draws near, we are excited to continue the learning process in the classrooms and at our extra-curricular activities and events. The 4th quarter of the school year is always full of fun and engaging opportunities for students, staff and parents to attend and celebrate the many accomplishments that happen at school. I hope all of you have time to attend our athletic events, concerts, plays, and the many other activities we have during the spring months! 
